Finding Law Journal Articles

HeinOnline: This database should be the first place researchers look for law review and law journal articles. All of the articles are image-based, PDF files and fully-searchable, meaning that they provide exact page images and enable the researcher to view all pages as they originally appeared in hardcopy-including all charts, graphs, and photographs! Also, the libraries in HeinOnline provide comprehensive coverage from the inception of each publication, something no other online publisher currently offers. All told, more than four centuries of content are available in HeinOnline.

JSTOR: Similar to HeinOnline, JSTOR provides PDF versions of many journal articles. This database provides access to materials in African-American Studies, Anthropology, Asian Studies, Ecology, Economics, Education, Finance, General Science, History, Law, Literature, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Population Studies, Sociology, Statistics. It is a digitized archive of the backfiles of selected scholarly journals. Full text available.

LexisNexis Academic Universe: LexisNexis provides full-text access to a wide range of legal materials, including case law, statutes, and regulations. It also include full text access to many law reviews and law journals.

LegalTrac: Indexes legal publications, major law reviews, law journals, specialty law and bar association journals, and legal newspapers on Federal and State Cases, Laws and Government Regulations, Legal Practice, and legal subjects such as Taxation and International Law. Coverage is from 1980-present. Links to full-text of some articles is available.

SSRN/bepress: The Berkeley Electronic Press publishes high quality peer-reviewed journals, as well as working papers, institutional repository materials, and a wealth of other scholarly information. The SSRN eLibrary consists of two parts: an Abstract Database containing abstracts on over 141,500 scholarly working papers and forthcoming papers and an Electronic Paper Collection currently containing over 111,300 downloadable full text documents in Adobe Acrobat PDF format.
